Decades of scientific innovation, community partnership and public health advocacy have helped to transform HIV into a preventable, chronic condition for millions of people.

Although new infections have declined by 32% between 2010 and 2021, progress against HIV in Asia continues to be uneven.^{1,3} Notably, 1 in 6 (or 260,000 out of 1.5 million) new HIV infections globally are found in Asia.^{1,2} Declining political commitment alongside punitive laws, rising stigma and discrimination, continue to be barriers to effective HIV responses.³

Gilead is committed to support UNAIDS's targets to end the HIV epidemic by 2030. To do this we will continue to advance scientific innovation and transformative collaboration to support the wellness of all people impacted by HIV until the virus is eliminated.

Life-Changing Innovation

We work to provide patients with innovative therapies that have to address unmet needs in HIV treatment and prevention. We are actively pursuing research that could, one day, lead to a cure.

Our Initiatives

- The **Gilead HIV Research Scholars Program** offers research grants of up to US\$130,000 to junior faculty researchers for a 2-year period in efforts to advance scientific knowledge in areas of unmet medical need.
- Fostered ongoing HIV healthcare professional education by supporting national, regional and international medical and HIV conferences.⁴

Advancing Equitable Care

Our dedication to innovation extends beyond the medicine to better support health systems and policies that improve access to HIV care.

Our Initiatives

- Launched the first <u>Asia cross-sectional assessment</u> in 2020 to understand the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on HIV prevention and care.
- Conducted the <u>HIV Telehealth Study</u> in 2022 to explore how digital services can help address gaps made more salient during the pandemic or enhance existing provision of HIV services.

We work with the community to end stigma and discrimination through partnership and corporate giving projects.

Our Initiatives

 Since 2018, the <u>Gilead Asia Pacific Rainbow Grant</u> has provided more than US\$4.5 million in funding support to 112 impactful CBO-led projects for HIV care, education and awareness. To accelerate progress towards Joint United Nations' Program's 95-95-95 goals, the 2023 grant cycle will focus on "Reducing Stigma & Improving Equity".



 The <u>Me and My Healthcare Provider Campaign</u> promotes best practice in healthcare service delivery by championing frontline workers who deliver stigma-free HIV care. Since 2021, we have partnered with the International AIDS Society to run the campaign in Brazil, Hong Kong, Mexico and Taiwan.

- We march in the **annual pride parades** in Taipei, Seoul, Hong Kong and support numerous LGBTQ+ celebrations across Asia.
- We are proud to be an official supporter and sponsor for the first Gay Games to be held in Asia in 2023. Together with Gay Games Hong Kong, we launched the <u>Colors of Life campaign</u> to celebrate our commitment in creating equal opportunities for all.
